Procurement Alliance North and North East Lincolnshire (PANNEL)

North Lincolnshire and North East Lincolnshire Councils have become among the first in the country to agree to join together to increase their buying power. They have formed Procurement Alliance North and North East Lincolnshire (PANNEL), which came into effect in May 2008.



The aim of the alliance arrangement is to:

- Benefit from the economies of scale and buying power of combined procurement spend
- Generate greater efficiencies and better value for money through working together
- Achieve strict Government efficiency targets
- Pool procurement knowledge, expertise and skills.

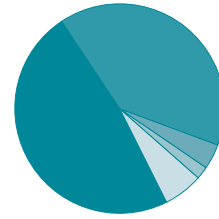
Supplier Satisfaction Survey

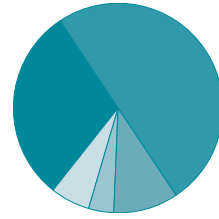
- That you are entitled to a request a debrief after tendering for a North Lincolnshire Council project.

What is SCMS?

SCMS stands for Supplier Contract Management System and is currently being rolled out across 22 Local Authorities across the Yorkshire and Humber Region.

It is a web-based system that provides a single core database to hold information about each council's contracts and suppliers. This will enable council's to identify and manage collaborative procurement activities.

North Lincolnshire Council are currently advertising most procurement exercises over the value of £50,000 on the supplier contract Management system. SCMS has been rolled out to 7 of the 10 council service areas and a total of 24 projects have been procured through the site to date.

- Support available from a dedicated helpdesk
