Introduction

This leaflet explains the concession available for users of North Lincolnshire Council Sports Facilities, who is eligible and how to apply for a concession card.

North Lincolnshire Council is committed to closing the gap in participation by under represented groups. The Active Choices Active Futures strategy sets out this commitment.

What is it?

Concession card holders will be entitled to a 50% discount on casual swimming, gym and health suite activities during off-peak times. These being Monday to Friday 9am to 4pm, and Saturday and Sunday 10am to 12 noon.

A concession card will also enable customers to book an activity up to eight days in advance and to pay on arrival – all you have to do is telephone reception, giving your concession card number and activity you wish to book.

The card is valid for 12 months and can be used at all Leisure Centres operated by North Lincolnshire Council

Who is eligible?

North Lincolnshire residents who are in receipt of:-

- Income Support
- Jobseekers Allowance
- Working Tax Credit
- Council Tax Credit
- Housing Benefit
- Pension Credit
- Registered Disabled
- Disablement Allowance
- Disability Living Allowance
- Attendance Allowance
- Full-time Student (min 21 hours)

Concession cards may be purchased for the dependants or partners of applicants where the dependant or partners are named on the notification letter showing entitlement to the relevant benefit or tax credit.

How to apply

You can purchase a concession card at any of our Leisure Centres by completing an application form and submitting it to reception with payment and proof of circumstance. Your application will be processed and you will be issued with your card which you will be able to use immediately.

Proof of circumstance

You will need to bring a valid benefit book or award notification letter as proof of your circumstance when applying for your card.

If you are applying for a concession card as a full-time student you will need to provide a letter from your educational establishment confirming you are in full-time education.
