## What are Changing Places toilets?

Standard accessible toilets do not meet the needs of every person with a disability.

People with profound and multiple learning disabilities, and people with other physical disabilities such as spinal injuries, muscular dystrophy and multiple sclerosis often need extra facilities to allow them to use the toilets safely and comfortably.

### **Changing Places toilets provide these extra facilities;**

- A height adjustable bench
- A tracking hoist system or mobile hoist
- Adequate space for a disabled person and up to two carers
- A privacy screen or curtain
