





Group 1 - Born in 2018: My First Animals

Help your toddler learn all about animals in *My First Animals*. From tiny mini beasts and sea creatures to big biters and stripy animals, *My First Animals* helps your toddler explore the wild world of creatures big and small.

Each page introduces a new animal group such as farm animals or baby animals to keep early learning simple and fun.

With colourful, bright photographs alongside clear word-labels your little one will know their beasties from their butterflies in no time.



Group 2 - Born in 2017: Peekaboo! Farm


Peekaboo! Farm will mean you and your baby can explore life on the farm all year long.

Your baby won't be able to wait to turn the page; watch with delight as they lift each flap to discover a new friendly farm animal beneath. Each spread contains baby-appropriate touch-and-feel elements perfect for little paws, such as sparkly foil, mirrors and soft fabrics. Keep an eye out for the friendly pig, the happy dog and other farmyard friends. The simple text encourages interaction between you and your baby while they develop imagination, thinking and memory skills.

Inspired by ESA astronaut Tim Peake and his sons, and featuring an introduction from Tim, this is the perfect bedtime book!




This board book edition a classic *Alfie* story is the perfect present for the little one in your life.



Group 5 - Born in 2014: I Can Only Draw Worms
