Definitive Map Modification (Public Footpath 71, East Halton) Order 2005(1)

This order is made by North Lincolnshire Council under section 53(2)(b) of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 ("the Act") because it appears to that authority that the County of Lincoln – Parts of Lindsey (Glanford Brigg) Definitive Map and Statement require modification in consequence of the occurrence of an event specified in section 53(3)(a)(i) – namely, the coming into operation of any enactment or instrument, or any other event, whereby a highway shown or required to be shown in the map or statement has been authorised to be stopped up, diverted, widened or extended – of the Act.

The authority have consulted every local authority whose area includes the land to which the order relates. North Lincolnshire Council hereby order that:

1. For the purposes of this order the relevant date is 3rd May 2005.
2. The County of Lincoln – Parts of Lindsey (Glanford Brigg) Definitive Map and Statement shall be modified as described in Part 1 and Part 2 of the Schedule and shown on the map attached to the order.
3. This order shall take effect on the date it is made and may be cited as the Definitive Map Modification (Public Footpath 71, East Halton) Order 2005(1).

SCHEDULE

PART 1

Modification of Parts of Lindsey (Glanford Brigg) Definitive Map

Description of path to be deleted

A – B as indicated on the map: A 272-metre-long footpath commencing on the east side of a footbridge crossing the East Halton Beck at grid reference TA1218620417, proceeding diagonally over a field in a south-easterly direction to join the existing footpath at the western end of a track leading to East Halton and at grid reference TA1229120165.

Description of path to be added

A – C as indicated on the map: A 160-metre-long footpath with a width of 1.25 metres commencing on the east side of a footbridge crossing the East Halton Beck at grid reference TA1218620417, proceeding along the eastern side of East Halton Beck in a southerly direction to the north-western end of a grass track at grid reference TA1219520259.

C – B as indicated on the map: A 160-metre-long footpath with a width of 1.25 metres commencing at the north-western end of a grass track at grid reference TA1219520259, proceeding in a southerly direction to join the existing footpath at the western end of a track leading to East Halton at grid reference TA1229120165.

PART 2

Modification of Parts of Lindsey (Glanford Brigg) Definitive Statement

Variation of particulars of path

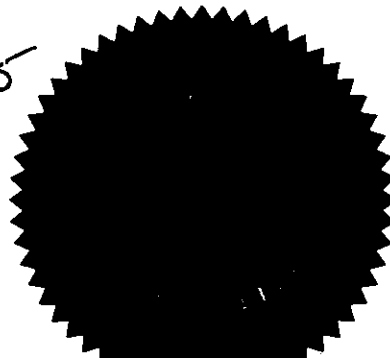
A 320-metre-long footpath commencing on the east side of a footbridge crossing the East Halton Beck at grid reference TA1218620417, proceeding along the eastern side of East Halton Beck in a southerly direction to the north-western end of a grass track at grid reference TA1219520259, and then along the same grass track in a southerly direction to join the existing footpath and the western end of a track leading to East Halton at grid reference TA1229120165. The footpath has a width of 1.25 metres throughout.

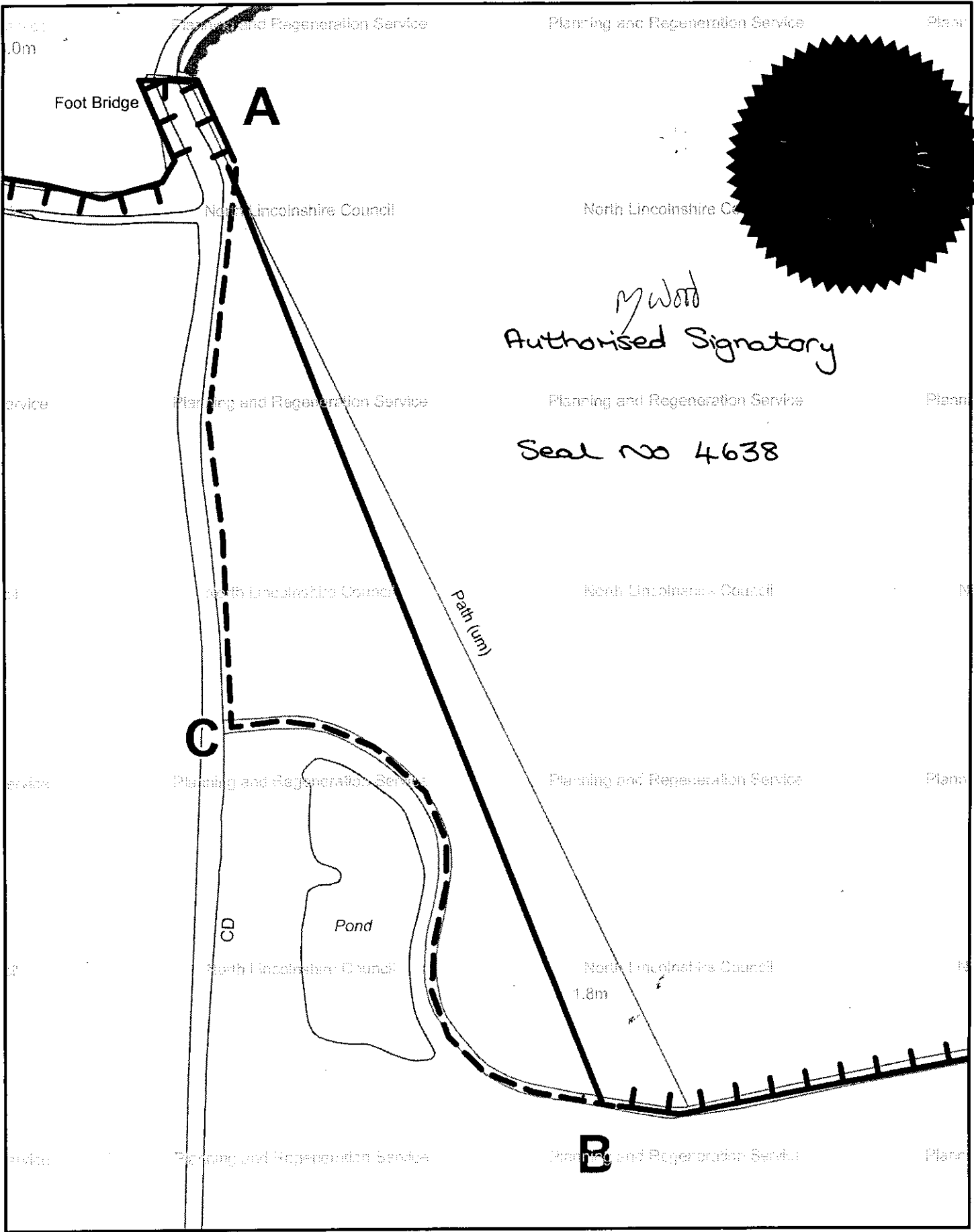
