

Playtime Baby is a delightful book for parents and babies to look at together. The beautiful illustrations show one little baby at each stage of her playtime: rolling on her play mat, stacking up blocks and having a hug with her favourite ted.

Ladybird Happy Baby Books are peep-through books showing babies in their daily routines, such as bedtime and bathtime. The rhyming text describes what is happening in each picture, as baby looks through the hole in the page to find out what the baby in the book is doing next.

Group 2 - Born in 2017: Sweet Dreams Peter


"As you climb into bed, let me give you a hug.





Group 5 - Born in 2014: Coat of Many Colors

Country music legend Dolly Parton's rural upbringing in the Smoky Mountains of Tennessee provides the backdrop for this special picture book. Using lyrics from her classic song "Coat of Many Colours," the book tells the story of a young girl in need of a warm winter coat. When her mother sews her a coat made of rags, the girl is mocked by classmates for being poor. But Parton's trademark positivity carries through to the end as the girl realises that her coat was made with love "in every stitch." Beautiful illustrations pair with Parton's poetic lyrics in this heartfelt picture book sure to speak to all young readers.

Group 6 – Born in 2013: Cockatoos

When eccentric Professor Dupont tries to track down his troupe of brightly-coloured cockatoos, they're always just one step ahead of him.

This counting book won the 1992 Smarties Children's Choice Award.
