



# Books of the Month


### Group 1 – Born in 2019: The Tale of Peter Rabbit

*The Tale of Peter Rabbit* was first published by Frederick Warne in 1902 and endures as Beatrix Potter's most popular and well-loved tale. It tells the story of a very mischievous rabbit and the trouble he encounters in Mr McGregor's vegetable garden!

### Group 2 - Born in 2018: All About Me

*All About Me!* Is a diverse and inclusive title which encourages action and relates to key stages in a child's development.





### Group 4 - Born in 2016: Mouse House

A story of home and hope from picture-book genius, John Burningham.




### Group 5 - Born in 2015: Give the Dog a Bone
