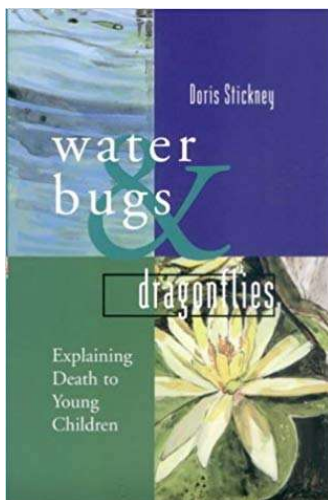
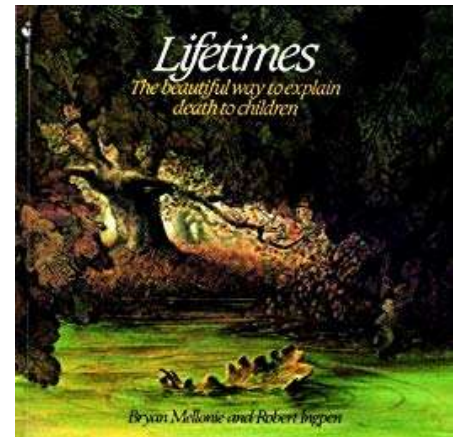

### **Water bugs and dragonflies : explaining death to young children / Doris Stickney**

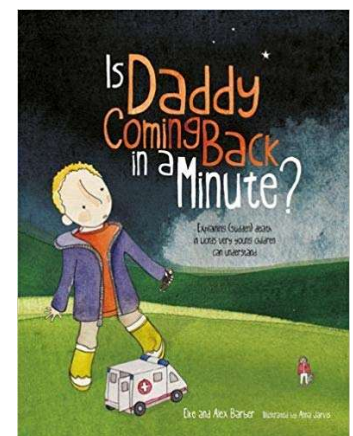

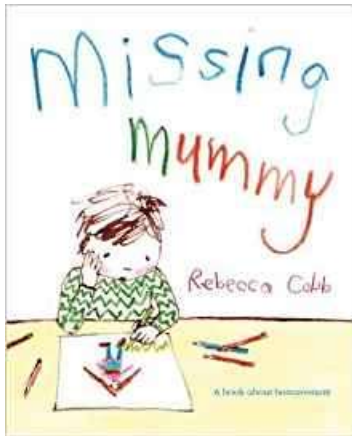

**Missing mummy / Rebecca Cobb**

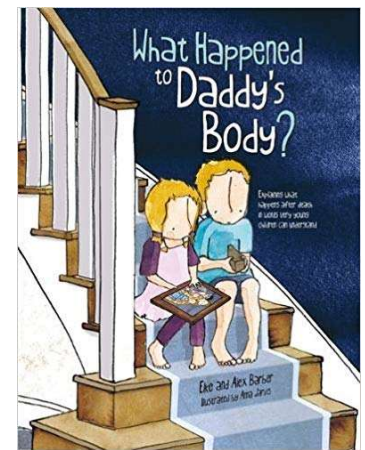

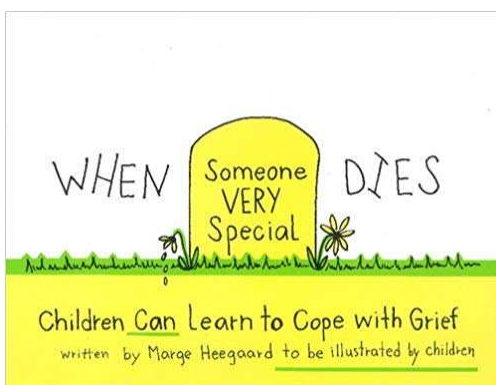

A practical format for allowing children to understand the concept of death and develop coping skills for life, this book is designed for young readers to illustrate.

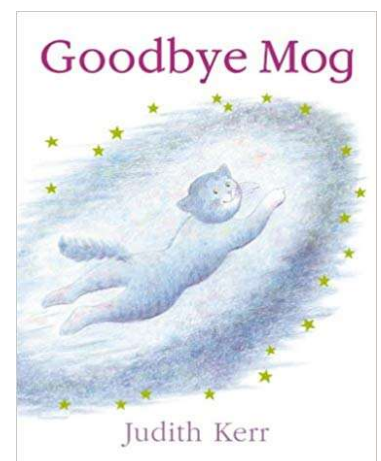

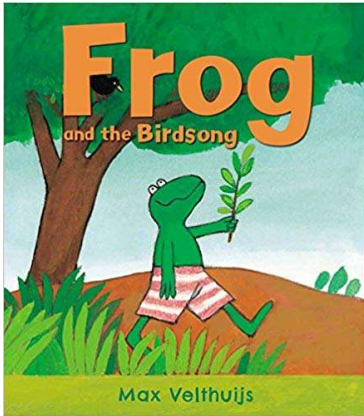


**Goodbye Mog / Judith Kerr**

### **Frog and the birdsong / Max Velthuis**

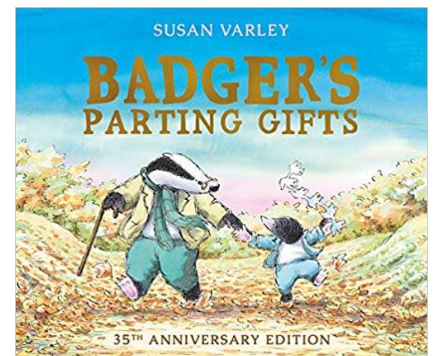

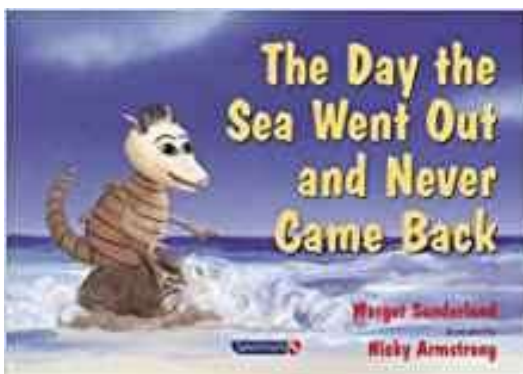
### **Badger's parting gifts / Susan Varley**

### **The day the sea went out & never came back : a story for children who have lost someone they love / Margot Sunderland**



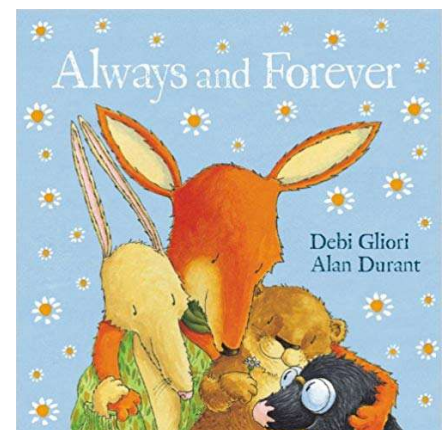
This book is written especially for children who have lost someone they love. A dragon called Eric loves to watch the sea ebb and flow but one day it goes out and never comes back.

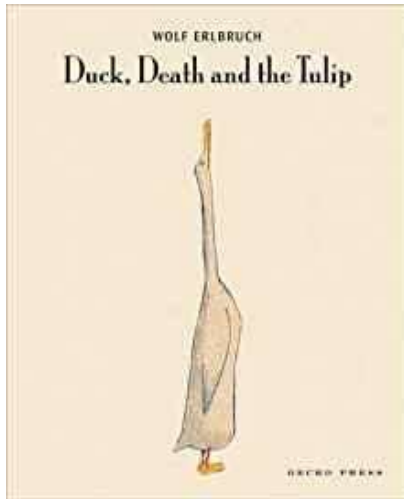
