

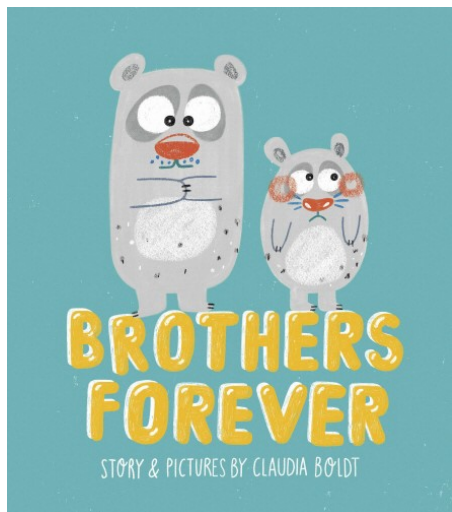

Have a dance party. Turn the music on and limber up!

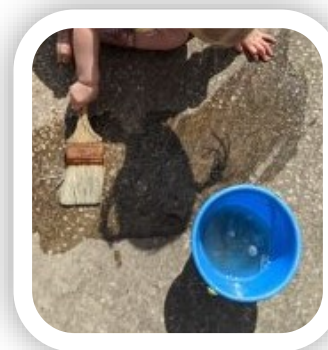
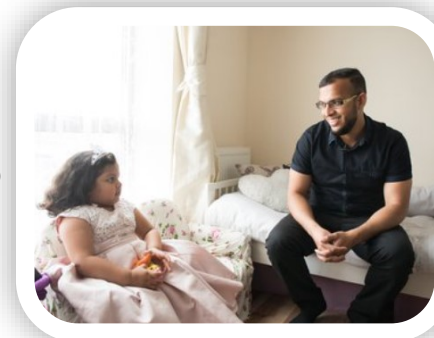
Get your little ones moving with some dance-related games like musical bumps and musical statues.
