### Rat-a-tat, Rat-a-tat, Who Can it Be?

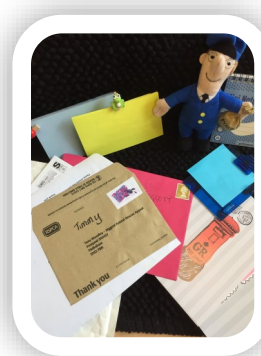
Rat-a-tat, rat-a-tat,

- Wrap some parcels. Guess what is inside?
