Where does this money come from?

Communities can access funds which SSE Renewables have made available on a voluntary basis near each of its renewable energy developments.

The SSE Community Fund is a grant scheme which has been set up as a result of the Wind Farm development to provide community benefit from 2018/19 funding for those living in the Gunness & Burringham Parishes. The fund is managed by North Lincolnshire Council.

What can grants be used for?  
What are the aims of the fund?

Community-focussed or charitable activities which:

- Encouraging and supporting communities who wish to strengthen their local community through the provision of facilities, events, activities or services to local children and young people, families, and adults of all ages
- Encouraging and supporting town and parish councils and voluntary groups to improve and develop new and existing services/activities
- Support and enable talented people to progress their development and realise their full potential in sport, arts, culture and education
- To develop projects which encourage energy efficiency.

For revenue projects, it is important to bear in mind that there is no guarantee of ongoing support. A key focus of the fund is sustainability and as such we encourage groups to be working towards being self sustainable where possible.

Applications where efforts have been made to explore other possible

	sources of grant funding and/or where <i>reasonable</i> efforts have been made to raise money through local fundraising activity will be looked upon favourably.										
How do I apply? How much is the fund worth?	The fund is worth £20,000 for the period of the 4 panels listed below.										
How much can I apply for?	<p>There are two applications available for this fund</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Up to £5,000 – Small Grant Application Form</li> <li>• Projects in excess of £5,000 – Large Grant Application Form must be used and these groups are requested to provide evidence of the support for the project from the community and consideration of the sustainability of the project.</li> <li>• Minimum 10% contribution must be made to support applications with a maximum of 5% being accepted in kind, however additional match funding will be favourable by the panel. In kind support must be evidenced through timesheets submitted with claims for funding. Maximum hourly rates to be accepted at unskilled £10/per hr or skilled £15/per hr.</li> </ul> <p>Multi year funding applications will be considered by the panel.</p>

Which areas can benefit from the fund?	The fund is exclusively available to those within the Guinness & Burringham Parishes										
How are decisions made?	A local panel, made up with representatives from the parish councils of Crowle and Ealand, Keadby with Althorpe, Amcotts, Garthorpe and Fockerby, Luddington and Haldenby and Eastoft, as well as the local ward councillors, a representative from SSE Renewables and supported by the Grants Team.										
Who can apply?	Groups or organisations which require funding to support projects or activities consistent with the priorities listed above.										

	<p>You don't need to be a registered charity to apply, but your organisation must have a constitution (governing document or set of rules) and be a non-profit organisation. If you require any further guidance please contact the Grants Team for advice.</p>
<p>When must grants be spent by?</p>	<p>Any grant received should be spent within 12 months of being awarded. However, we understand that on occasions there are delays to completing projects which are out of the control of the organisation. In these cases we request you contact the Grants Team to discuss the reason for the delay which will allow the panel to consider extending the time period.</p>
<p>Are there any activities you are unable to support?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Projects which do not meet the SSE Local Keadby Wind Farm Fund priorities.</li> <li>• Projects which should be funded through the LEA or Parish Precept.</li> <li>• Projects which do not benefit people living within Gunness &amp; Burringham.</li> <li>• Individuals, or groups without a constitution (governing document or set of rules).</li> <li>• The advancement of religion or politics (including requests to support the core activities of religious or political groups).</li> <li>• The purchase of second hand vehicles, plant and equipment which is older than three years. For anything older than three years, please contact the Grants Team to discuss a potential application.</li> <li>• The purchase of firearms.</li> <li>• Costs of energy consumption (instead we encourage funding to be used to provide energy efficiency measures which help reduce energy consumption).</li> <li>• The repayment of loans or payment of debts.</li> <li>• Trips abroad</li> <li>• Costs already incurred or activities which will take place before we have made a decision on an application (retrospective funding).</li> <li>• Payments towards areas generally understood to be the primary responsibility of statutory authorities.</li> <li>• Activities contrary to the interests of the SSE group of companies.</li> <li>• Activities likely to bring the council, the company, or any member of the SSE group of companies into disrepute (for example anti-wind farm/renewable energy activities).</li> </ul>
