

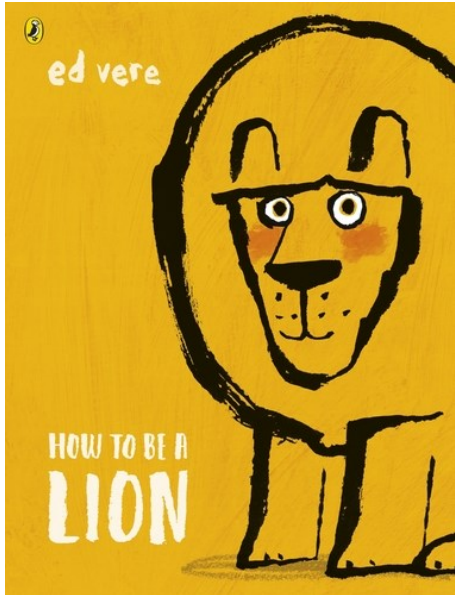

**Top Tip:** No need to stick or glue your design just take a picture when you have finished then start again!

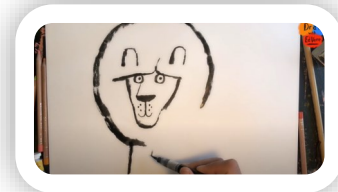


## How To Be A Lion Fun things to do!
