

# ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR CRIME AND POLICING ACT 2014

## SECTION 59

### **NORTH LINCOLNSHIRE PUBLIC SPACES**

#### **PROTECTION ORDER 2020**

NORTH LINCOLNSHIRE COUNCIL (the Council) in exercise of its powers under Section 59 of the Anti-social Behaviour Crime and Policing Act 2014 (the Act), being satisfied that the conditions set out in Section 59 of the Act have been met, including being satisfied that the anti-social behaviour arising in the restricted areas has had a detrimental effect on the quality of life of those in the locality makes the following order:

1. This Order applies to the public spaces delineated in blue annexed to this Order (Maps A, B & C)
  - a. Failing to stop drinking or to surrender alcohol after having been required to do so by a duly authorised person (authorised person being a Police Officer, Police Community Support Officer or a Council Officer) in the areas outlined in blue on Map A & B.
  - b. To prohibit a single person having more than four dogs in their sole charge.
  - c. To exclude dogs within enclosed children's play areas and other designated sites such as schools.
  - d. A person is required to immediately remove dog faeces left by any dog which at the time the person is in charge of or responsible for.
  - e. A person is prohibited to loiter, lodge or beg in the street or ask persons whether known or not for any item including but not limited to money, cash, change or food, or sit directly outside or under any shop premise or cashpoint machine within the area outlined in blue on Map A.
  - f. A person is prohibited from riding a motor bike, quad bike or mini moto in a manner deemed by an authorised person to be anti-social and they reasonably suspect that person is causing or is likely to cause nuisance, harassment, alarm or distress to any other person within North Lincolnshire.
  - g. Any person is prohibited from peddling goods within the area outlined in blue on Map C.

2. Any person who without reasonable excuse fails to comply with the requirements of the Order commits an offence and shall be liable, on summary conviction, to a fine not exceeding level 3 on the standard scale.
3. Where a constable or authorised person has reason to believe an offence in relation to this Order has been committed, the person committing the offence may be issued with a Fixed Penalty Notice. The payment of a Fixed Penalty Notice provides the opportunity of discharging any liability to conviction for the offence.
4. If any interested person desires to question the validity of this Order on the grounds that the Council had no power to make it or that any requirement of the Act has not been complied with in relation to this Order, he or she may apply to the High Court within 6 weeks from the date on which this Order is made.
5. The Order shall come into force on 22 October 2020 and expire on 21 October 2021.

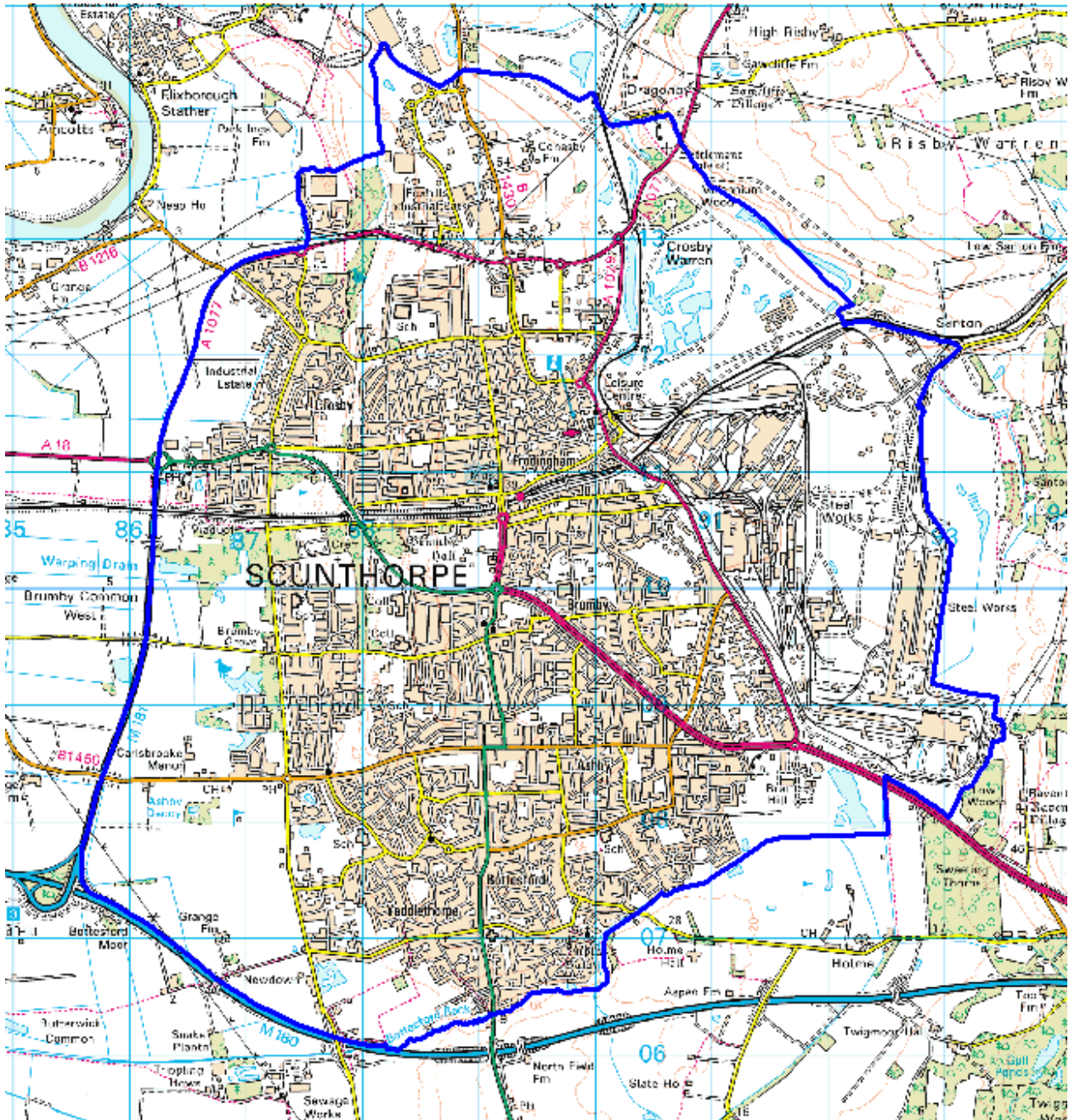
