You must agree to abide by this policy if you want to use library computers.

You must:

- Be a current library member
- Abide by the system for booking and using library computers.

You must not:

- Create, access, store, post, or publish any material which is: obscene, discriminatory, defamatory, or illegal; causes harassment or offence to other service users or staff; breaches copyright regulations
- Download or install any software onto library computers
- Use library computers to access television broadcasts or BBC iPlayer
- Attempt to alter system settings
- Damage library equipment in any way
- Connect any external hardware, apart from USB storage devices, to library computers.

Please be aware that:

- Giving out personal and financial details over the internet is done at your own risk
- North Lincolnshire Council can take no responsibility for the security of financial transactions undertaken via the internet
- North Lincolnshire Council can take no responsibility for the accuracy and currency of information you may find on the internet
- North Lincolnshire Council can take no responsibility for damage to, or loss of data from, devices that have been connected to library computers
- A filtering system is in place to restrict access to some web content. If you find that this system is restricting access to web content which you believe to be legitimate, please refer the issue to a member of staff
- We reserve the right to monitor your use of library computers. We may share this information with the police to assist in the prevention and detection of crime, and in the interests of safeguarding
- Library staff reserve the right to suspend your access to library computers. This will happen if you continue to misuse library computers after staff have asked you not to.
