1. Apologies

Lucy Stephenson sent her apologies.

2. Notes of Last Meeting and Matters Arising

Notes of meeting dated 4th July 2022 were agreed as a true record.

Community Energy vacancy – Malcolm Bailey. Email regarding Mr Baileys experience previously distributed. Panel agreed to invite Mr Bailey to future meetings.

Deferred application - (SDF 074) – Changing Lives through Changing Minds - Creation of level concrete pathway and installation of composite doors.

The group have since updated their lease wording so that it is clear the lease is for a term of 20 years commencing 2017, therefore has 15 years remaining. The group have requested their application be reconsidered. Application brought back to panel with updated quotes and the group have now confirmed that the number of sessions made available in addition to commissioned places is 54 which is 38% of their availability. The figures for places available to people outside North Lincolnshire Council is currently 8% with the projected figure 28%. Current free places for people within North Lincolnshire is currently 25% with a projected figure of 24%.

3. Projects Update

SDF 076 - Scunthorpe Bowls Club

Email had been sent to panel explaining that due to increased costs in materials the group were £6,000 short to carry out the project. The group had asked the panel to consider a variation to the project of a further £6,000. Panel agreed to this variation. Total amount of grant allocated to Scunthorpe Bowls Club is now £30,000.

SDF 078 - Ancholme Rowing Club

Email had been sent to panel explaining that due to increased costs the group were £7,317 short to carry out the project. The group had asked the panel to consider a variation for this amount. Panel agreed to fund the variation. Total amount of grant is now £ 28,879.

Panel requested Grants Team to include in offer letters an advisory recommendation that costs are secured at the earliest opportunity to mitigate price increases. All groups to seek approval for any variations.

SDF 047 - Conservation Volunteers – Twigmoor Woods – Project completed, awaiting claim.

4. Finance Update

There was £168,750 available to spend which includes approved variations from Scunthorpe Bowls Club and Ancholme Rowing Club. Applications to the value of £26,239.

Fund Priorities

The fund is to be used to provide support for community focussed or charitable activities for strategic projects in North Lincolnshire in which SSE Renewables are investing. Applications must meet one or more of the following priorities:

- **1. Creating opportunities**: Create or enhance opportunities for education and employment through activities that develop skills and improve an individual's chance of entering the workplace.
- **2. Empowering communities:** Empower communities to become more resilient and protect vulnerable residents through measures which demonstrate long-term social, environmental, or economic improvements.
- **3. Sustainable places:** Stimulate meaningful regeneration to improve or enhance local infrastructure, landscape, biodiversity, or heritage and make a lasting difference to the places we live, work and visit.

The fund will give priority to those applications which address at least one of the following:

- Climate Change
- Biodiversity
- Energy Resource efficiency
- Natural heritage

Fund priorities agreed.

The leverage is worked out on the total value of projects against the amount put in from SDF. This equates to SDF being 4th out of 34 funds for the additional funding invested in the successful projects within the area. LD confirmed the error had been rectified.
