- Cut out and decorate a tail and attach to the main body part.
- Stick jets of water spouting from the whale's head by using pipe cleaners or twisted pieces of paper.



Use your whale as a prop when sharing the story.

- The blue whale is the largest animal on the planet, weighing as much as 200 tons (approximately 33 elephants).
- The blue whale has a heart the size of a small car.
- It's stomach can hold one ton of krill and it needs to eat about four tons of krill each day.
- They are the loudest animals on Earth and are even louder than a jet engine!
