Children love playing with a cardboard box.

Use the box to play peek-a-boo. Your child can sit inside and pretend it is a car, a boat or a plane! Give them some crayons or pens and they can decorate it too. Don't forget to chat as you play, letting your child take the lead.

Counting and talking about numbers will help your child learn early maths skills. You can count when doing everyday activities such as climbing the stairs, and you can count snacks or toys. Looking for numbers on doors, buses and cars will also keep them entertained whilst you're out and about.
