Help ladybird name favourite animals, fruit and vegetables, a big wheeled tractor and more!

Talking Tip: Lots of toddlers make mistakes when they first start talking. Watch this short top tips video which shows how you can help them to say the words properly.

Learning New Words



This book introduces lots of different and new words all linked to the farm. Point to the pictures and say the word to help your child learn these as you share the book.

Helping your child learn new words can be part of everyday activities too. When you are out shopping ask your child to find things in different categories like fruit or vegetables.

Play Follow the Leader.

Make sure you talk about what you're doing and repeat words lots of times! For example, **'Simon says shake your hands, shake, shake, shake'**, **'Simon says stamp your feet, stamp, stamp, stamp'**.

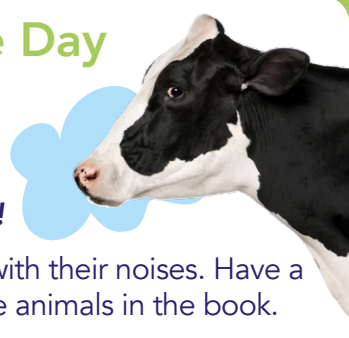


Include opposites in the instructions (up / down, stop / go, loud / soft, high / low) and take turns!

Repeat verse one adding a sheep and then a pig, with their noises. Have a go at making up some verses of your own using the animals in the book.
