





Counting Fun



Use daily routines as opportunities to help your child learn to count.

At bedtime: "OK, we're counting to 3 and then it's time for bed. Help me count... 1, 2, 3."

At bath time: "We will wash your tummy 1, 2, 3 times! Ready? 1, 2, 3."

While walking, count your steps, "Let's count them... 1, 2, 3."

Try this activity at different times of the day.

Make counting fun – you could add silly voices as you count too!

Continue counting down with each verse until you get to 1 little duck and then sing...
