Naming Pictures

Just name the objects in the pictures for your child. They may start to attempt to say them. How much vocabulary a child has is very important to their future.

In fact, research tells us that it affects a child's school performance – a child's vocabulary when they are five years old can tell us how well they do at school at 11.

Helping children to develop a good vocabulary is vital. By one year old children are usually saying single words although not usually pronounced correctly. By 18 months they may know 20 words or more!
