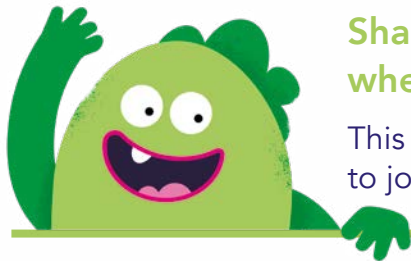


# THE LITTLE RED HEN

## Homemade Playdough

Making homemade playdough is a fun way for your child to explore their creativity and learn new words. Why not give it a go?

You can make playdough in next to no time from everyday ingredients found in your kitchen cupboards.

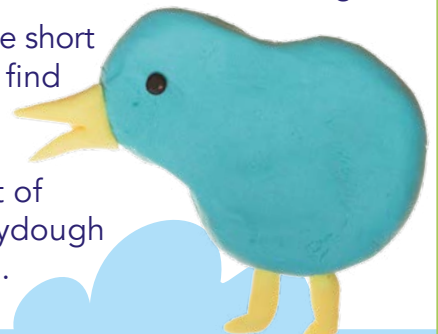
Our great playdough recipe is simple to make, will only take a few minutes and will keep for a long time:

For one playdough ball, mix together:

- 8 tbsp plain flour
- 2 tbsp table salt
- 60ml warm water
- 1 tbsp vegetable oil
- food colouring (optional)

You can store your playdough in a plastic sandwich bag in the fridge to keep it fresh. Don't forget to squeeze out the air from the bag.
